Call To Confession

Leader: Malachi 4: 1 reminds us of the importance of confession. For behold, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble. The day that is coming shall set them ablaze, says the Lord of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. Let us confess our sin before God and seek God's mercy.

Prayer of Confession

All: Loving God, when the prophets said, "Look!" They were excited because The One you had promised and they had been waiting for was on the way! But too often we confess that we do not look for your divine Savior the same way. Too often, we try to make "saviors" of ourselves and others around us. We do not place enough of our trust in you either, O God. Instead we put our faith in our own efforts and others around us. Lord, forgive our arrogance, we pray. Forgive our lack of faith. Forgive us for all the times we walk through trials of our own making. We ask that you would refine us ... cleanse us ... make us fit for the work you have called us according to your purpose. Lord, open our eyes today to see the joy of our salvation in the One you sent and are sending again to be our Redeemer. Amen.

Assurance of Pardon

New Testament Reading: Matthew 1: 18-25

18 This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. 19 Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

20 But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. 21 She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

22 All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 23 "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" — which means, "God with us."

24 When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. 25 But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.
