Merry Christmas! I don't know about you, but these days I sometimes have to
actually work at focusing my attention in the right place at Advent & Christmas
time. There is just so much going on in my life here at the church, at home, and in
my extended family. It is easy to catch myself just going through the motions dur-
ing Advent and sort of "miss" what Christmas is all about. I have had to make a
habit each year, to really put aside a little time, push all the busyness and business

habit each year, to really put aside a little time, push all the busyness and business of my day-to-day life to the side for just a little bit, and spend time focusing on what it means for Christ to have come into this world, how he utterly transformed it through his life, death, and resurrection, and to reflect on what it means that he is coming again.

This year, one devotion that helped me stop for this crucial moment before Advent came from an Advent Devotion from Biola University last year. This devotion was written by Dr. Adam Johnson. I pray that 3 of the many things Johnson shared in his devotion: (1) the lyrics to the song, "I Wonder as I Wander," (2) the picture by Rembrandt of Paul in Prison, and (3) Paul's words in 1 Timothy 1: 15-17 might touch you this year, like it has touched me.

"I Wonder As I Wander" I wonder as I wander, out under the sky How Jesus my Savior did come for to die For poor ordinary people like you and like I I wonder as I wander, out under the sky.

If Jesus had wanted for any wee thing, A star in the sky or a bird on the wing, Or all of God's Angels in heaven to sing, He surely could have it, 'cause he was the King.

I wonder as I wander, out under the sky How Jesus my Savior did come for to die For poor ordinary people like you and like I I wonder as I wander, out under the sky.

1 Timothy 1: 15-17

This saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost. But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life. To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.

In this picture, the Apostle Paul, with his belongings scattered about him, is shown sitting on his bed confined in a prison cell. But his expression does not indicate a man imprisoned, but a man determined to minister and pray on behalf of churches and believers around the world. The pen in his left hand suggests that maybe he was in the middle of writing one of his many letters to the churches of Colossae, Ephesus, or Philippi. Or maybe he was writing to a friend in ministry like Timothy or Titus. The light from the window envelops his head like a halo. The large sword leaning on the bed may be a symbol of his impending martyrdom or perhaps reminding us of the sword of the Spirit described in Ephesians 6:17. Despite his hardships and imprisonment, Paul did not despair in his incarceration, but saw it as an opportunity to further the Gospel and the Kingdom of God.

Paul reminds all of us in 1 Timothy 1: 15, that "this saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost." As we "wander about" this Advent, may each of us take the time to stop in WONDER of Christ, who came from heaven

to die for poor ordinary people like Paul, like you, and like me. Is it WONDER in Paul's eyes as he sits in prison in Rembrandt's painting? May that same sort of WONDER be found in our eyes this Advent!



DISIPLESHIP TOOL WORKSHOP

This new year, there is a brand-new class on the horizon that will take place during the Sunday School hour at Union. But make no mistake, this is not a "normal" Sunday School class. It's more like a workshop! Have you ever wondered if there is more to this whole "following Christ" thing? We all know that as Christians we are supposed to get better at listening to God through reading the Bible, to find ways to connect our hearts to His, and to attempt to better be Christ's hands and feet in the world. But are there certain tools out there that we could be using to make all that listening, connecting, and following easier and would help us follow Christ more closely?



Starting December 7, our older youth, and interested young adults and older adults will have an opportunity to learn about some of the Christian discipleship tools that are out there and how we might better use them. Each week, we will start the class in the Gathering Area to learn more about a new discipleship tool and then break up into smaller groups where we can put that tool into practice!

The first workshop, **beginning January 7**, we be a six-week study on Matthew 14:13-21. That's right! Six weeks on the same passage!! We will be **"Digging in Deep with the Feeding of the 5000!"** There's a huge difference between Devotional and Deep Study when reading of the Bible. Both are important in our walks with God. But many of us do not **STUDY** God's Word nearly as often as we read it devotionally. Some of us might not even know how to truly God's Word. Join us as we explore 6 tools that anyone can use to dive into the Bible more deeply. The class will give you an opportunity to practice using some Bible tools that you might be a little rusty with. Some of the tools might even be brand new to you! Join us as we all grow in our ability to read, understand, and listen to God's word for our lives.
