John 18: 25-27





NEW HOLY WEEK SERVICE: PASSOVER REMEMBRANCE MEAL

Isn't Passover a Jewish thing? Yes, but it is also a Christian thing since Christ celebrated Passover all the years of his life and even most importantly on the night before he died. Simply stated, for a Christian the Passover meal gives us an opportunity to reflect on who Jesus is and His ultimate sacrifice as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

This year we will be celebrating our own Christian Passover Remembrance Meal on Maundy Thursday, March 28 at 6:00 PM. To make sure we have everything needed for the meal, everyone who wants to participate will need to sign up ahead of time. Sign-ups will be made available each Sunday beginning on March 3 with a deadline of March 17.



HISTORY OF THE CHRISTIAN SEDER/ PASSOVER MEAL

Christians celebrate two major events annually – the birth of Christ and the resurrection of Christ. Christmas celebrations are tied closely to church and home with families having their own traditions as well as attending services together at church. Celebrating the Passover together provides an opportunity for Christians to share a meal together during Holy Week, step into the final week of Jesus' life, His death, and resurrection and bridge the Old and New Testaments.

On the night before Christ was crucified, Jesus shared the Passover meal with his disciples, instituting the Lord's Supper. The meal looked back on God's miraculous deliverance of His people from Egyptian slavery which brought them freedom. Today, we observe the Lord's Supper as a way of commemorating Jesus' death and burial.

As we have grown in the Christian faith, we know the importance of the imagery of "blood" —The blood of the Passover Lamb spread over the doorposts of each home brought deliverance from death, just as Jesus' blood does. This theme of Christ as the sacrificial Lamb is woven through the theology of the New Testament. But much of the rest of the Seder Meal can connect us to what Christ has done as well. By using all five senses, we can see the meaning of symbols of the Passover in a new way.

- Unleavened bread: This bread reminds us of Jesus' body as it was broken on our behalf.
- Green vegetable: Represents new life, growing and discipleship in Christ.
- Salt water: As believers, we crossed through the waters of baptism to walk into freedom and eternal life; also for the tears shed for our salvation.
- Bitter herbs (horseradish): We remember the bitterness of sin in our lives before Christ.
- Charoset (a mixture of apples, nuts, cinnamon and honey): This reminds us how our most difficult circumstances are sweetened by the hope we have in God.
- Roasted egg: As Christians, this represents new life.
- Roasted lamb bone: Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

Our Passover Meal Celebration will also include a time to Bless the Children. Parents will be able to place their hands on each of their children's heads and repeat a blessing, calling them by name. The meal will also include a meal of chicken tenders, macaroni and cheese, and oriental slaw. We hope that you will join us on March 28th!
