Old Testament Reading: Genesis 11: 1-9

<u>11:1</u> Now the whole world had one language and a common speech. <u>2</u> As men moved eastward, they found a plain in Shinar and settled there.

3 They said to each other, "Come, let's make bricks and bake them thoroughly." They used brick instead of stone, and tar for mortar. <u>4</u> Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city, with a tower that reaches to the heavens, so that we may make a name for ourselves and not be scattered over the face of the whole earth." <u>5</u> But the LORD came down to see the city and the tower that the men were building. <u>6</u> The LORD said, "If as one people speaking the same language they have begun to do this, then nothing they plan to do will be impossible for them. <u>7</u> Come, let us go down and confuse their language so they will not understand each other." <u>8</u> So the LORD scattered them from there over all the earth, and they stopped building the city. <u>9</u> That is why it was called Babel — because there the LORD confused the language of the whole world. New Testament Reading: Acts 2: 1-13

2:1 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. 2
Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.
5 Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. 6 When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. 7 Utterly amazed, they

asked: "Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? <u>8</u> Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language? <u>9</u> Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, <u>10</u> Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome <u>11</u> (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs — we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" <u>12</u> Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"
