Dear Members and Friends of Union Church.

In the New Testament book of Philemon, Paul tries to encourage Philemon to see his slave, Onesimus, in a different light now that Onesimus has become a believer. I love verses 15 and 16 of Philemon. Paul writes to Philemon, "Perhaps the reason [Onesimus] was separated from you for a little while was that you might have him back for good — no longer as a slave, but better than a slave, as a dear brother. He is very dear to me but even dearer to you, both as a man and as a brother in the Lord." I think the use of the word "dear" in the NIV here misses some of the oomph of what Paul is trying to say. A much better translation in my mind would be the word "beloved." The NIV probably didn't use this word because people don't use the word "beloved" the same way today. But "beloved" is what Paul means in this passage. Paul wants Philemon to understand that because of his faith, Philemon should now see Onesimus as a brother to be loved in Christ.

Paul's words in this passage should challenge each of us. Few of us in the church today call fellow followers of Christ our brothers and sisters... much less a beloved. Most of the time we just think of other church goers as friends or fellow Christians. But that's not how the early church spoke of one another. In the book, "More than Christians: Practicing Gospel-Shaped Community with the Language of the Early Church," Norman Hubbard writes that the early church NEVER used the name

"Christian" to refer to one another. Huggard argues that in the New Testament, the name Christian was generally only used by non-Christians to talk about Christians and most of the time it was probably used as a put down. So, what did Christians call one another? They used words like

brother, sister, disciples, saint, or beloved to address one another.

Now, I am not writing all this because I think we need to start calling one another "beloved." I actually visited a church where the pastor called the congregation "his beloved" each Sunday and it semmed sort of weird. However, there is something important going on here. When we call one another Christian, we are simply saying that we are each followers of Christ. But as Hubbard writes in "More the Christians," Scripture indicates that following Christ is more than just a philosophical choice, it is about a change that happens in our hearts, souls, and relationships with everyone around us. Hubbard argues that Jesus brings justification, redemption, and reconciliation to hearts. Justification changes our relationship with God and others by dealing with our guilt and need for forgiveness. Redemption changes our relationships with God and others by freeing us from our bondage to sin. And reconciliation changes our relationship with God and others by bringing peace to the enmity sin places between us and others.

So, let's go back to that word "beloved." I think most of us think of that word as a "feeling" word. A word to use with those we feel a deep love for. But in the New Testament, love is not as much about feelings as it is about behavior. We choose to love people. It's why Jesus says that it is possible to love our enemies (even though they are our enemies). Hubbard writes, "Calling someone your 'beloved in Christ' is a statement about who they are, not how you feel. Loving someone is not the same thing as feeling close to them, though the latter may come the longer we choose love... Your 'beloved' is not your spouse or that unique friend who shares almost everything with you. Your 'beloved' are those who have Christ in common with you, even if you share nothing else. Because God chose you, you are 'beloved' to one another. Because God chose you, you choose to love."

In Christ, our hearts, souls, and relationships have been changed. The way we hurt God and others has been forgiven by God. The way sin wraps us up in bondage from God and others has been hacked away. And it has all been replaced with peace. Being in Christ should change our whole world view. That's what Paul is trying to tell Philemon. When Philemon looks at his slave, Onesimus, he should no longer see a slave. He should see another disciple of Christ, forgiven and freed from sin, and in a brand-new relationship with God and others thru Christ. It should change everything.

I don't think that referring to fellow believers in Christ as "beloved" is going to make a comeback anytime soon. But I do think how we view one another in Christ can and should grow so much deeper. Are you ready to view other believers as more than just Christians?

LOAVES & FISHES STORE



It will be open directly after Worship every Sunday in May starting May 4th. Please stop in and shop to help our Youth serve the Lord through this ministry. The items you purchase will be taken to CAM for their use.

PRAYER FOR THE COMMUNITY & WORLD



-Frontier Fellowship in South Asia: Please keep in prayer the work of Indopartners in Indonesian. In February, more than 100 Indonesians met in person with members of the ministry after interacting with Indopartners' Digital Gospel resources. 18 chose to follow Christ. Let us pray that these individuals find church communities to be discipled in. Let us also pray for the new Pakistan house churches that have started. Pray for wisdom, courage, and discernment for these new church leaders. Training for these churches depends on relationships between trainers in India and house church leaders in Pakistan. The ability for these individuals to connect is currently being hindered by the Pakistan-India conflict which has closed borders and increased tension and violence in the region.

-National Day of Prayer: May 1st is National Day of Prayer. Let us keep churches across the country in our prayers as they gather together. Locally, <u>Firestone Wesleyan Church</u>, is having a community time of pray on <u>May 1st at 7:30AM, 12PM, and 6PM</u>. Pastor James will be joining them for prayer at 7:30AM.

-End of the School Year: As students and teachers are wrapping up school this month, let us keep in them in prayer. We can pray for end-of-year testing, for the safety of students over the summer (particularly for children of poverty who receive so much support in terms of resources and food during the school year), and for school graduates who are moving on to new adventures and challenges. And may students and teachers alike grow in their walk with Christ over the summer.
