Dear Union Presbyterian Church Friends and Members,

I went to seminary with a secret. It's a secret that I had not told anyone. Mostly, I didn't tell anyone because it wasn't something I even liked to admit to myself. But truth be told... I went to seminary knowing that I was terrible at prayer. My personal prayer life was a mess for as long as I could remember.

It's easy to be terrible and to stay terrible at personal prayer. Since personal prayer is done privately and silently, the only people who ever need to know that you are bad at it is you and God. For the five years or so before seminary I had been a church youth director. I knew what personal prayer with God was supposed to look like. I knew how to pray out loud in church services, youth meetings, and even one on one with youth. I was just no good at personal prayer with God. I was so bad in fact that I had long given up doing it with any sort of regularity. But since I was a youth director getting ready to seminary, I felt like it would be a very bad thing to admit to anyone else that I was struggling with it.

I was the king of falling asleep while trying to pray. My personal prayer time never felt like God and I were bonding. It usually just felt like I was talking to myself. When I would pray, I always went into it with the best intentions. But sometimes even seconds after I started praying, I would start thinking about something else. Maybe I would start thinking about how the thing a just prayed related to something someone told me earlier that day. Which would get ne thinking about someone else I'd been thinking about and then something else that I'd done that day. This might get me thinking about a TV show I had recently seen, which would get me thinking about how hungry I was. As soon as I realized I was off track, I would always stop my train wreak of a prayer in order to spend some time berating myself. Then I would try praying again... asking for forgiveness and promising God that I would do better this time (only to have my mind immediately start wandering again). I was always so secretly envious of others who described themselves as having rich and intimate times with God through prayer.

In the book, "Where Prayer Becomes Real: How Honesty with God Transforms Your Soul," authors Kyle Strobel & John Coe describe a very similar situation in their opening chapters. Particularly Strobel, admits to really wrestling with a wandering mind during prayer. Strobel and Coe argue that ultimately there are these 4 fundamental aspects of prayer, that are necessary to have a more transformative time of with God.

They write that we must come to understand that:

"Prayer is not a place to be good, it is a place to be honest. Prayer is not a place to perform, It is a place to be present. Prayer is not a place to be right, it is a place to be known. (And) (p)rayer is not a place to prove your worth, it is a place to receive worth and offer yourself in truth."

Reading their list, it makes sense now why my prayer life was such a mess. The only part of prayer I had down pat at this time of my life were "performance prayers;" prayers I would do out loud and in front of others where I was more concerned with how I sounded than anything else. In my personal prayers, I often was trying to prove to God (and myself) that I was good enough to be talking to him, I rarely was honest with God about my doubts and concerns, and I beat myself up over whether or not I was praying the "right" way.

During Seminary, it was learning about the Ignatius practice of prayer called "Examen" that saved my prayer life. The idea behind this prayer practice is simple. You simply walk through your day with God. You can think, "When was I thankful? What might God have been calling me to do in particular situations?" You could look for sins you may have committed during the day. You could explore all your interactions with others to see how God may have used those people to teach you something, how God may have



blessed you with certain interaction, or even ponder how you might interact with that person differently in the future. But it's more than just thinking about your day. It's walking through it with God. Thanking him when it makes it sense to, repenting when you should, and asking for help when it is evident that it is needed. The "Examen" made my crazy wandering prayers not the "problem" with my prayer life but the point of it. And I found that when I prayed this way regularly, my other personal prayers wouldn't be so chaotic anymore. Also, it allowed me to do something else that Strobel and Coe write about in "Where Prayer Becomes Real." It helped me stop berating myself when my mind wandered, and instead ask God, "God, my mind just started to thinking about this random thing... why do you think this jumped in my head? Is it important? Or is it just a way my sinful heart is keeping me from you?" Regardless of why my mind wandered, answering that question with God would often draw me closer to Him.

I still catch myself periodically falling into personal prayer slumps. And practicing the "Examen" with God is still the prayer practice that helps me out of those slumps. What about you? What keeps your prayers to God honest? What keeps you "present" with God in prayer? How do you keep from getting too bogged down by trying to do prayer the "right" way instead of focusing on just making yourself known to God? My prayer is that this Summer, each of us might come to have a more honest closeness to God through our prayers.

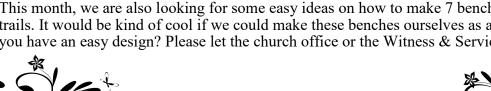


s Walking
